RSA Students Doing PSEO • College Bound... NOW!

This is what we are all about. We assure that all high school students pass their college entrance exams to be eligible to enroll in college. All PSEO students must complete the Minnesota requirements for graduation so college work is integrated into high school curriculum to assure all standards and benchmarks are completed. Strategy 2018 is a plan to have current 9th graders graduate with a high school diploma and a 2-year college degree in 2018.

Supplementing High School Study with a PSEO college campus experience accomplishes several things:

- 1. It inspires students to excel at high school coursework beginning in grade 9.
- 2. It initiates focus for students to excel in math and reading to pass Accuplacer/ACT exams.
- 3. It propels teachers and parents to identify strategies for students to do what it takes to prepare for college and actually enroll before graduation.
- 4. It provides students with the experience of being a college student while having the emotional and academic supports of home and high school to help with the transition from high school to college.
- 5. It is FREE to students and parents. At RCTC that equals \$192 a credit. This year, RSA students are receiving more than \$10,000 of college tuition at no charge to their parents.
