<b><u>Linguistic</u></b>	Verbal-linguistic intelligence refers to an individual's ability to analyze information and produce work that involves oral and written language, such as speeches, books, and emails.			
<b><u>Logical-Mathematical</u></b>	Logical-mathematical intelligence describes the ability to develop equations and proofs, make calculations, and solve abstract problems.			
<b><u>Visual-Spatial</u></b>	Visual-spatial intelligence allows people to comprehend maps and other types of graphical information.			
<b><u>Intrapersonal</u></b>	Intrapersonal intelligence refers to people's ability to recognize and assess those same characteristics within themselves.			
<b><u>Interpersonal</u></b>	Interpersonal intelligence reflects an ability to recognize and understand other people's moods, desires, motivations, and intentions.			
<b><u>Musical</u></b>	Musical intelligence enables individuals to produce and make meaning of different types of sound.			
<b><u>Bodily-Kinesthetic</u></b>	Bodily-kinesthetic intelligence entails using one's own body to create products or solve problems.			
<b><u>Naturalistic</u></b>	Naturalistic intelligence refers to the ability to identify and distinguish among different types of plants, animals, and weather formations found in the natural world.
